


By the numbers – Violent crime

Q3 2022:

- Violence within Centre City comparable to five-year average
- Rest of the city saw a 9% increase


Centre City & Citywide Violent Crime



5-year average: 5644



By the numbers – Gender-based violence



- 62% of victims of violence were male, 37% were female
- Stranger assaults were higher in the Centre City than in the rest of the city, and men were more likely to be assaulted by a stranger




By the numbers – Street harassment

Beginning June 1, 2022, the amended Public Behaviour Bylaw 54M2006, which restricts harassment of another person in a public space, goes into effect. The amended bylaw is one of several actions The City of Calgary is taking to support victims and deter the negative behaviour; making it clear that street harassment will not be tolerated in Calgary.

Calgarians will now be able to report personally experienced or witnessed instances of street harassment in public spaces for investigation. An offence of the bylaw carries a fine of \$500.


Between June 1 and end of November 2022:

- 50 complaints were received. Of those:
 - Three identified as likely street harassment
 - Three identified as possible hate-motivated incidents











Drug Seizures – Crime Indicator





By the numbers – Transit






By the numbers - Disorder

Q3 2022:

- Centre City rates on par with the five-year average
- Rest of the city saw a 6% reduction in disorder

Call Diversion Initiatives

Unwanted Guests (DOAP)

- Business owners can call DOAP directly for any unwanted guests
- DOAP = quicker response time than police for unwanted guest
- Aug. 2022 (launch)
 – end of
 Dec. 2022 1,662 unwanted
 guest calls for service

Pilot began February 2022







Crime prevention for businesses

- Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED)
- Security evaluations and target hardening checksheets

CCTV Tips

- Test your cameras to make sure they are working
- Ensure high-quality images to identify suspects
- Have purposeful focus
- Position at least one camera to have level line of sight of patrons
- Ensure staff can access video content
- Move video to cloud-based storage

Crime in progress, crimes against people, emergency situations impacting safety or health

Property crime, non-injury collisions, late-reporting of violence against people, including all forms of abuse, robberies and break and enters

Theft from vehicle, property or credit/debit card, mischief to vehicle or property, lost property, attempted stolen vehicle, break and enter detached garages, secure parkades, storage lockers

Unwanted guests, unhoused individual sleeping in doorways, poor mental health moments, use of substance in public place, unhoused needing transportation

Resources for mental health, addiction, disability, children/families, food and basic needs, employment, legal, housing, newcomers, seniors, Indigenous peoples and youth
